11 An Act relating to poor persons; requiring that state
12 not opt out of certain law; requiring certain
13 information to be included on application and
14 reapplication; providing for noncodification; and
15 providing an effective date.

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17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
19 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

20 A. Pursuant to the authorization given to the states under
21 Section 115(d)(1)(A) of the federal Personal Responsibility Act of
22 1996, P.L. 104-193, the state shall not opt out of the requirements
23 of Section 115(a) of the federal Personal Responsibility and Work
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1 Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, P.L. 104-193, which shall
2 disqualify individuals from participating in the food service
3 program if they have been convicted of a state or federal felony
4 offense committed after August 22, 1996.

5 B. Pursuant to Section 115(c) of the federal Personal
6 Responsibility Act of 1996, P.L. 104-193, each individual applying
7 for the food service program shall state during the application
8 process whether he or she or any member of his or her household has
9 been convicted of an offense described in subsection A of this
10 section. Such information shall also be required at any
11 reapplication.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
