

1 2. Children of Oklahoma firefighters who have given their lives
2 in the line of duty;

3 3. Children of members of the Oklahoma Law Enforcement
4 Retirement System who have given their lives in the line of duty or
5 whose disability is by means of personal and traumatic injury of a
6 catastrophic nature, as defined by Section 2-300 of Title 47 of the
7 Oklahoma Statutes, and occurred in the line of duty; and

8 4. Children of Oklahoma emergency medical technicians who have
9 given their lives in the line of duty.

10 B. Such waiver of resident tuition and nonresident tuition
11 shall be limited to a period of five (5) years.

12 C. Such waiver of resident tuition or nonresident tuition to
13 the children of deceased peace officers and to the children of
14 deceased firefighters as provided for in this section shall be a
15 service benefit of each Oklahoma peace officer and Oklahoma
16 firefighter.

17 D. For purposes of this section:

18 1. "Firefighter" means a volunteer firefighter or a permanent
19 salaried professional member of any fire department within the State
20 of Oklahoma; and

21 2. "Emergency medical technician" means a person volunteering
22 or employed as an emergency medical technician and who is licensed
23 as an emergency medical technician pursuant to Section 1-2505 of
24 Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
