9                   A Resolution proclaiming April 2, 2013, as the 17th  
10 Annual 4-H Day at the State Capitol; recognizing 4-H  
11 as the largest youth development organization in the  
state and the nation; and challenging others to join  
their Revolution of Responsibility.

14                   WHEREAS, 4-H youth across the nation are leading a revolution of  
15 responsibility in their communities, focusing on the fourth H -  
16 Health: Health for better living in my club, my community, my  
17 country, and my world; and

18                   WHEREAS, 4-H is the largest youth development organization in  
19 Oklahoma and the largest in the nation with six million young  
20 people; and

21                   WHEREAS, 4-H in Oklahoma reaches 114,000 youth members and 9,000  
22 volunteers annually; and

23                   WHEREAS, 4-H is part of the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension  
24 Service provided by Langston University and Oklahoma State

1 University, where youth are encouraged to discover their passion,  
2 adopt a growth mindset, practice self-reflection and set goals which  
3 contribute to a healthy lifestyle; and

4 WHEREAS, 4-H has connected youth and their communities with the  
5 innovative research and resources from our nation's 106 land-grant  
6 universities and colleges for more than 100 years; and

7 WHEREAS, 4-H youth are the "now", the living, breathing,  
8 cultural change agents leading a revolution of responsibility for  
9 doing the right thing, breaking through obstacles and making a  
10 measurable difference in the communities and state where they live.

11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES  
12 OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 54TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
