11 An Act relating to cities and towns; amending 11 O.S.
12 2011, Section 12-111, which relates to police
13 departments; requiring town board of trustees to
14 appoint chief of police; and providing an effective
15 date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2011, Section 12-111, is
18 amended to read as follows:

19 Section 12-111. ~~The~~ If a police department is established, the
20 board of trustees ~~may~~ shall appoint a chief of police, who shall
21 enforce municipal ordinances and have such other powers, duties and
22 functions as may be prescribed by law or ordinance. The chief of
23 police may appoint police officers as he or she deems necessary,
24 subject to the approval and confirmation of the board of trustees.

1 All references in the Oklahoma Statutes to the town marshal shall
2 mean the town chief of police.

3 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
