3 2. Provide preventive services to the chronically ill and aged;

4 3. Maintain vital records and statistics;

5 4. Assist the State Commissioner of Health in the performance
6 of official duties, and perform such other acts as may be required
7 by the Commissioner; ~~and~~

8 5. Enter into written agreements with the governing body of any
9 municipality or county for the performance of services within the
10 respective jurisdictions and authorities that are necessary and
11 proper pursuant to the authority granted to municipalities and
12 counties by the Constitution and the laws of this state; and

13 6. A county department of health, a district department of
14 health, a cooperative department of health, and a city-county
15 department of health may assess an administrative fee for the
16 provision of immunizations to children less than eighteen (18) years
17 of age who are not eligible under the Vaccines for Children Program.

18 B. A county department of health, a district department of
19 health, a cooperative department of health, and a city-county
20 department of health may maintain programs for mental health and day
21 care for children.

22 C. Nothing contained herein relating to pollution shall be in
23 conflict with the existing jurisdiction of any other state
24 environmental agency.

1 D. Except as otherwise provided by law, responsibility for the
2 licensing and inspection of nursing facilities and specialized
3 facilities, as defined in the Nursing Home Care Act and for the
4 enforcement of state health and safety standards applicable to such
5 facilities, shall be reserved to the State Department of Health and
6 shall be exercised pursuant to the provisions of the Nursing Home
7 Care Act.

8 E. Except as otherwise provided by law, responsibility for the
9 licensing and inspection of any establishment where food or drink is
10 offered for sale or sold, in accordance with the provisions of
11 Section 1-1118 of this title, and for the enforcement of state
12 health and safety standards applicable to such establishments, shall
13 be reserved to the State Department of Health.

14 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
15 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

16 The State Department of Health shall be authorized to establish
17 a pilot program to provide immunizations to children less than
18 eighteen (18) years of age who are not otherwise eligible under the
19 Vaccines for Children Program. Such pilot program shall include,
20 but not be limited to, the requirement of providing payment in
21 advance of immunization.

22 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
