



1 for persons who are dually eligible for Medicaid and Medicare that  
2 may be implemented in the state; and explore options for cost  
3 containment and delivery alternatives for those persons, that are  
4 consistent with the mission of the agency. Study results shall  
5 include, but not be limited to:

- 6 a. an assessment of the present environment in which dual  
7 eligible persons are receiving care,
- 8 b. analysis of current initiatives, both statewide and  
9 nationwide, with the aim of more cost effective,  
10 coordinated care for dual eligible persons. This  
11 shall include a feasibility analysis of other state  
12 approaches with special attention paid to  
13 applicability to Oklahoma infrastructure and waiver  
14 and/or state plan authorization from the Centers for  
15 Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS),
- 16 c. input from stakeholders on current models available to  
17 dual eligible persons that emphasize strategies for  
18 cost containment and delivery alternatives, and
- 19 d. development of recommendations accompanied with any  
20 associated projected expenditures or cost savings.

21 B. The Authority shall prepare and deliver the study to the  
22 Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services and the  
23 Appropriations and Budget Subcommittee on Public Health and Social  
24 Services by December 31, 2013.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.

2 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
3 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
4 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
5 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
