3 B. The task force shall be comprised of nine (9) members to be
4 appointed by the Governor as follows:

- 5 1. A high school English teacher;
- 6 2. A high school mathematics teacher;
- 7 3. A high school social studies teacher;
- 8 4. A high school science teacher;
- 9 5. A school district administrator;
- 10 6. Two elementary school teachers;
- 11 7. A physical education teacher; and
- 12 8. A music teacher.

13 The chair of the task force shall be selected by the Governor.

14 C. A quorum of the task force shall be required to approve any
15 final action of the task force. For purposes of this section, five
16 (5) members shall constitute a quorum.

17 D. The task force may meet as often as may be required in order
18 to perform the duties imposed upon it.

19 E. The meetings of the task force shall be subject to the
20 Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.

21 F. Members of the task force shall receive no compensation or
22 travel reimbursement.

23 G. Staff support shall be provided by the State Department of
24 Education.

1 H. The task force shall submit a report by July 1, 2014, of its
2 findings and recommendations to the Governor, the President Pro
3 Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
4 Representatives.

5 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.

6 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
7 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
8 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
9 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
