

1 2. All judges having juvenile docket responsibility shall
2 attend at least twelve (12) hours of training in such courses each
3 calendar year relating to the topics described in paragraph 1 of
4 this subsection.

5 3. The Administrative Director of the Courts shall be
6 responsible for developing and administering procedures and rules
7 for such courses for judicial personnel, including monitoring the
8 attendance of judicial personnel at such training.

9 B. 1. Any district attorney, assistant district attorney,
10 public defender, assistant public defender, attorney employed by or
11 under contract with the Oklahoma Indigent Defense System, court-
12 appointed ~~or retained~~ attorney, or attorney employed by or under
13 contract with a district court whose duties include juvenile docket
14 responsibility shall complete at least six (6) hours of education
15 and training annually in courses relating to the topics described in
16 paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section. These education and
17 training requirements may be accomplished through a collaborative
18 effort between the judiciary and others with juvenile docket
19 responsibilities.

20 2. Each judicial district shall be responsible for developing
21 and administering procedures and rules for such courses for
22 attorneys identified in this subsection whose duties routinely
23 include juvenile court docket responsibilities. The chief judge of
24 each judicial district, or any designee judge with juvenile docket

1 responsibilities, shall carry out this mandate within one (1) year
2 of the effective date of this legislation.

3 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
