22 growth and strength of our Nation in countless recorded and
23 unrecorded ways; and

1 WHEREAS, American women have played and continue to play a
2 critical economic, cultural and social role in every sphere of the
3 lives of the people of our Nation by constituting a significant
4 portion of the labor force working inside and outside of the home;

6 WHEREAS, American women have played a unique role throughout the
7 history of our Nation by providing the majority of the volunteer
8 labor force. American women were particularly important in the
9 establishment of the early charitable, philanthropic and cultural
10 institutions of our Nation; and

11 WHEREAS, American women from all walks of life have served as
12 leaders in the forefront of every major movement to restore and
13 safeguard the rights and liberties guaranteed by the Constitution of
14 the United States. They have been leaders, not only in securing
15 their own rights of suffrage and equal opportunity, but also in the
16 abolitionist movement, the emancipation movement, the industrial
17 labor movement, the civil rights movement, and other movements to
18 create a just society for all.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION
20 OF THE 54TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
