19                   A Concurrent Resolution declaring April 29, 2014, as  
20                   "Breast Cancer Awareness Day" in the State of  
21                   Oklahoma; and directing distribution.

1       WHEREAS, breast cancer is the most common cancer among American  
2 women, besides skin cancers, with one in eight women being diagnosed  
3 in her lifetime; and

4       WHEREAS, breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer  
5 deaths in women, and is projected to claim the lives of nearly  
6 40,000 women this year; and

7       WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates that nearly  
8 233,000 new cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed in  
9 women in 2014; and

10       WHEREAS, death rates from breast cancer have been declining  
11 since 1990 because of earlier detection through screening, increased  
12 awareness and improved treatment; and

13       WHEREAS, there are now more than 2.8 million breast cancer  
14 survivors in the U.S.; and

15       WHEREAS, breast cancer in men is rare, but it does occur. In  
16 2014, it's estimated that nearly 2,400 men will be diagnosed with  
17 breast cancer and around 430 will die from the disease. While far  
18 less common in men than in women, men still have a 1 in 1,000 chance  
19 of getting breast cancer in their lifetime.

20       NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION  
21 OF THE 54TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

2 the 6th Annual "Breast Cancer Awareness Day" in the State of  
3 Oklahoma.
