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12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 10A O.S. 2011, Section 2-4-101, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 2-4-101. A. In each county having a population of
16 eighty thousand (80,000) or more, as shown by the last preceding
17 Federal Decennial Census, there is created a juvenile bureau and a
18 citizens' advisory committee.

19 1. The juvenile bureau shall be responsible for the provision
20 of juvenile justice services to children, youth, and families
21 located within its county and subject to the jurisdiction of the
22 juvenile division of that county's district court.

23 2. For the purposes of this section, "juvenile justice
24 services" may include, but not be limited to:

1 a. services provided to the child or youth to remediate
2 or alleviate the conditions that led to court
3 involvement, including educational, vocational-
4 educational, medical, substance abuse treatment, and
5 other programs that may be beneficial to the child or
6 youth,

7 b. services provided to the parent, legal guardian, legal
8 custodian, stepparent, or other family members or
9 adults subjecting themselves to the jurisdiction of
10 the court to remediate or alleviate the conditions
11 that led to the adjudication of the child or youth,
12 including programs to strengthen the family unit,
13 prevent or correct child abuse or neglect, or to
14 assist the family in providing proper care and
15 supervision of the child or youth,

16 c. community-based diversion and preventive services and
17 programs to assist in diverting children and youth
18 from the juvenile justice system. Such programs may
19 include, but not be limited to, medical, educational,
20 vocational, social and psychological guidance,
21 training, counseling, substance abuse treatment,
22 recreation, mediation, crisis intervention,
23 transitional living, independent living and other
24 rehabilitative services, and

1 d. services or programs provided in collaboration with
2 other juvenile justice agencies or programs as defined
3 in Section 2-7-902 of this title.

4 B. In each county having a duly constituted juvenile bureau as
5 of January 1, 2005, as provided for in subsection A of this section,
6 the juvenile bureau shall remain in place and continue in operation.
7 No other counties shall establish juvenile bureaus.

8 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
