16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 44, Chapter 229, O.S.L.
18 2013 (63 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1-103a.1), is amended to read as
19 follows:

20 Section 1-103a.1. A. To assist and advise the State Board of
21 Health and the State Department of Health, there are hereby created:

- 22 1. The Consumer Protection Licensing Advisory Council;
- 23 2. The Trauma and Emergency Response Advisory Council;
- 24 3. The Infant and Children's Health Advisory Council;
4. The Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council; and
5. The Home Care and Hospice Advisory Council.

1 B. 1. Each Public Health Advisory Council (Advisory Council)
2 created pursuant to subsection A of this section shall consist of
3 seven (7) members. Two members shall be appointed by the Governor,
4 two members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
5 Representatives, two members shall be appointed by the President Pro
6 Tempore of the Senate, and one member shall be appointed by the
7 State Board of Health. Appointments shall be for three-year terms.
8 Members of the Advisory Councils shall serve at the pleasure of and
9 may be removed from office by the appointing authority. Members
10 shall continue to serve until their successors are appointed. Any
11 vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original
12 appointments. Four members shall constitute a quorum.

13 2. Each Advisory Council shall meet at least twice a year, but
14 no more than four times a year and shall elect a chair, a vice-chair
15 and a secretary from among its members. Each Advisory Council shall
16 only meet as required for election of officers, establishment of
17 meeting dates and times; rule development, review and
18 recommendation; and adoption of nonbinding resolutions to the State
19 Department of Health or the State Board of Health concerning matters
20 brought before the Advisory Council. Special meetings may be called
21 by the chair or by the concurrence of any three members.

22 C. 1. All members of the Consumer Protection Licensing
23 Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of certain consumer issues
24

1 as specified below. The Consumer Protection Licensing Advisory
2 Council shall be composed as follows:

3 a. the Governor shall appoint:

4 (1) one member who is a licensed radiologist
5 assistant, and

6 (2) one member who is a licensed audiologist,

7 b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:

8 (1) one member who is a licensed radiologist, and

9 (2) one member representing the hearing aid fitting
10 industry,

11 c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
12 appoint:

13 (1) one member representing the medical
14 micropigmentation industry, and

15 (2) one member representing the hearing-impaired
16 public, and

17 d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member
18 representing a diagnostic x-ray facility.

19 2. The jurisdiction areas of the Consumer Protection Licensing
20 Advisory Council shall include the hearing-aid-fitting industry, the
21 medical micropigmentation industry, the radiation industry and such
22 other areas as designated by the State Board of Health.

23 D. 1. All members of the Trauma and Emergency Response
24 Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in a

1 hospital setting and issues that arise concerning emergency
2 response. The Trauma and Emergency Response Advisory Council shall
3 be composed as follows:

4 a. the Governor shall appoint:

5 (1) one member who is an administrative director of a
6 licensed ambulance service, and

7 (2) one member who is a Board Certified Emergency
8 Physician,

9 b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:

10 (1) one member who is a representative from a
11 hospital with trauma and emergency services, and

12 (2) one member who is a trauma surgeon with
13 privileges at a hospital with trauma and
14 emergency operative services,

15 c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
16 appoint:

17 (1) one member representing the trauma registrar of a
18 licensed hospital that is classified as providing
19 trauma and emergency operative services, and

20 (2) one member who is an Emergency Medical
21 Technician, and

22 d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member who
23 is a critical care nurse.

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1 2. The jurisdictional areas of the Trauma and Emergency
2 Response Advisory Council shall include emergency response systems
3 development, injury prevention, catastrophic health emergency,
4 trauma systems improvement and development and such other areas
5 designated by the State Board of Health.

6 E. 1. All members of the Infant and Children's Health Advisory
7 Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in the area of
8 infant and children's health care. The Infant and Children's Health
9 Advisory Council shall be composed as follows:

10 a. the Governor shall appoint:

11 (1) one member who works for the state or for a
12 political subdivision on child abuse issues, and

13 (2) one member who is knowledgeable about childhood
14 immunizations,

15 b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:

16 (1) one member who is knowledgeable about newborn
17 screening issues, and

18 (2) one member licensed by the state as an
19 optometrist who has knowledge of vision screening
20 for children,

21 c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
22 appoint:

23 (1) one member who is licensed by the state as a
24 physician and works as a pediatrician, and

1 (2) one member who is licensed by the state as a
2 genetic counselor, and

3 d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member who
4 is a physician licensed by the state who specializes
5 in the diagnosis and treatment of childhood injuries
6 in a trauma setting.

7 2. The jurisdictional areas of the Infant and Children's Health
8 Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise in the area of
9 health care for infants and children and such other areas as
10 designated by the State Board of Health.

11 F. 1. All members of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory
12 Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in the area of
13 advancing the health of all Oklahomans. The Advancement of Wellness
14 Advisory Council shall be composed as follows:

15 a. the Governor shall appoint:

16 (1) one member who is knowledgeable about breast and
17 cervical cancer issues, and

18 (2) one member who is knowledgeable about ~~organ donor~~
19 ~~issues~~ epidemiological issues in this state,

20 b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:

21 (1) one member who is mayor of a city or town that
22 has been designated a certified healthy community
23 in an urban setting, and
24

1 (2) one member who is the president or chief
2 operating officer of a business that has been
3 designated a certified healthy business,
4 c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
5 appoint:

6 (1) one member who is the mayor of a city or town
7 that has been designated a certified healthy
8 community in a rural setting, and

9 (2) one member who is the president or chief
10 operating officer of a business that has been
11 designated a certified healthy business in an
12 urban setting, and

13 d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member who
14 is the Executive Director of the Tobacco Settlement
15 Endowment Trust.

16 2. The jurisdictional areas of the Advancement of Wellness
17 Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise in the areas of
18 tobacco usage and cessation, ~~organ and tissue donation~~
19 epidemiological issues, the requirements for a city or town in the
20 state to be designated as a certified healthy community, the
21 requirements for a business to be designated as a certified healthy
22 business and such other areas as designated by the State Board of
23 Health.
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1 G. 1. All members of the Home Care and Hospice Advisory
2 Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in the
3 administration and practice of home care and hospice services. The
4 Home Care and Hospice Advisory Council shall be composed as follows:

5 a. the Governor shall appoint:

6 (1) one member who is the owner or administrator of
7 an entity licensed in accordance with the
8 Oklahoma Hospice Licensing Act, and

9 (2) one member who is an owner or administrator of an
10 entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma
11 Home Care Act,

12 b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:

13 (1) one member who is an owner or administrator of an
14 entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma
15 Hospice Licensing Act, and

16 (2) one member who is an owner or administrator of an
17 entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma
18 Home Care Act,

19 c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
20 appoint:

21 (1) one member representing the public who is or was
22 a legal guardian of a recipient of hospice
23 services, and
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1 (2) one member representing the public who is a
2 recipient or legal guardian of a recipient of
3 services from a home health agency, and

4 d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member
5 representing an association which advocates on behalf
6 of home care or hospice issues.

7 2. The jurisdictional areas of the Home Care and Hospice
8 Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise in the areas of
9 home care or hospice services, and such other areas as designated by
10 the State Board of Health.

11 H. In addition to other powers and duties assigned to each
12 Advisory Council pursuant to this section, each Advisory Council,
13 within its jurisdictional area, shall:

14 1. Have authority to recommend to the State Board of Health
15 rules on behalf of the State Department of Health. The State
16 Department of Health shall not have standing to recommend to the
17 State Board of Health permanent rules or changes to such rules
18 within the jurisdiction of an Advisory Council which have not been
19 submitted previously to the appropriate Advisory Council for action;

20 2. Before recommending any permanent rules to the State Board
21 of Health, give public notice, offer an opportunity for public
22 comment and conduct a public rulemaking hearing when required by the
23 Administrative Procedures Act;

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1 3. Have the authority to make nonbinding written
2 recommendations to the State Board of Health and/or to the State
3 Department of Health which have been concurred upon by at least a
4 majority of the membership of the Advisory Council;

5 4. Have the authority to provide a public forum for the
6 discussion of issues it considers relevant to its area of
7 jurisdiction, and to:

8 a. pass nonbinding resolutions expressing the sense of
9 the Advisory Council, and

10 b. make recommendations to the State Board of Health or
11 the State Department of Health concerning the need and
12 the desirability of conducting meetings, workshops and
13 seminars; and

14 5. Cooperate with each other Advisory Council, the public, the
15 State Board of Health and the Commissioner of Health in order to
16 coordinate the rules within their respective jurisdictional areas
17 and to achieve maximum efficiency and effectiveness in furthering
18 the objectives of the State Department of Health.

19 I. The Advisory Councils shall not recommend rules for
20 promulgation by the State Board of Health unless all applicable
21 requirements of the Administrative Procedures Act have been
22 followed, including but not limited to notice, rule-impact statement
23 and rulemaking hearings.

1 J. Members of the Advisory Councils shall serve without
2 compensation but may be reimbursed expenses incurred in the
3 performance of their duties, as provided in the State Travel
4 Reimbursement Act. The Advisory Councils are authorized to utilize
5 the conference rooms of the State Department of Health and obtain
6 administrative assistance from the State Department of Health, as
7 required.

8 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2220.2, as
9 amended by Section 75, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp. 2013,
10 Section 2220.2), is amended to read as follows:

11 ~~Section 2220.2. A. The State Department of Health and the~~
12 ~~State Department of Education, giving consideration to the~~
13 ~~recommendations of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council~~
14 ~~created in Section 44 of this act, shall develop organ donor~~
15 ~~education awareness programs to educate the general public on the~~
16 ~~importance of organ donation and shall recommend priorities in the~~
17 ~~expenditures from the Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and Awareness~~
18 ~~Program Fund~~ There is hereby established within the State Department
19 of Health the Organ Donor Education and Awareness Program Advisory
20 Council which shall consist of the following members appointed by
21 the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate:

22 1. One representative from an organ procurement organization in
23 this state that is certified by the United States Department of
24 Health and Human Services;

1 2. One representative from a tissue procurement organization in
2 this state that is certified by a national association of tissue
3 banks;

4 3. One representative from an Oklahoma eye bank that is
5 certified by a national eye bank enucleation organization;

6 4. Four members representing organ, tissue and eye recipients
7 and their relatives, or donors and relatives of donors who are
8 residents of this state; provided, however, such appointments shall
9 be geographically representative of the four regions of the state;

10 5. One representative from an Oklahoma transplant center that
11 is a member of a national organ procurement network; and

12 6. Three at-large members who have demonstrated an interest in
13 organ donor education and awareness and who are residents of this
14 state.

15 B. 1. Of the initial appointments made to the Oklahoma Organ
16 Donor Education and Awareness Program Advisory Council pursuant to
17 the provisions of subsection A of this section, the Governor shall
18 designate four members to serve terms of four (4) years, four
19 members to serve terms of three (3) years, and three members to
20 serve terms of two (2) years. After the initial appointments,
21 members appointed to the Advisory Council shall serve terms of four
22 (4) years. Members shall serve until successors are appointed and
23 qualified. A member may be removed by the Governor for cause.
24 Members may serve no more than two full terms consecutively. A

1 vacancy on the Advisory Council shall be filled in the same manner
2 as the original appointment, for the unexpired portion of the term.

3 2. The Advisory Council shall elect from among its membership a
4 chair and a vice-chair and shall adopt procedures for the governance
5 of its operations. The Advisory Council shall meet at least
6 semiannually. Six members shall constitute a quorum for the
7 transaction of business.

8 3. Members of the Advisory Council shall receive no
9 compensation for their services but may be reimbursed for reasonable
10 and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties
11 by the State Department of Health pursuant to the provisions of the
12 State Travel Reimbursement Act.

13 4. The State Commissioner of Health may employ such staff as
14 necessary to carry out the provisions of this act; provided,
15 however, the cost of administration of this act shall not exceed
16 twenty percent (20%) of the total funds credited to the Oklahoma
17 Organ Donor Education and Awareness Program Revolving Fund,
18 including administrative fees paid to the Oklahoma Tax Commission
19 and the Commissioner for Public Safety pursuant to the provisions of
20 Section 2220.3 of this title.

21 B. In administering this act, the ~~State Department of Health~~
22 ~~and the State Department of Education are~~ Advisory Council is
23 authorized, but not limited to:

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1 1. Develop and implement educational programs and campaigns to
2 increase organ donation in Oklahoma;

3 2. Make policy recommendations for the promotion of organ
4 donation in Oklahoma;

5 3. Recommend priorities in the expenditures from the Oklahoma
6 Organ Donor Education Program Fund;

7 4. Accept and hold property; and

8 5. Utilize local resources including volunteers when
9 appropriate.

10 C. ~~The State Department of Health and the State Department of~~
11 ~~Education~~ Advisory Council shall annually submit to the Governor and
12 the Legislature a report detailing its expenditures of fund monies,
13 its activities, the status of organ donation in the state, and any
14 recommendations for legislative changes by the first day of December
15 beginning December 1, 2002.

16 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2220.3, as
17 last amended by Section 76, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp.
18 2013, Section 2220.3), is amended to read as follows:

19 Section 2220.3. A. There is hereby created in the State
20 Treasury a revolving fund for the State Department of Health, to be
21 designated the "Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and Awareness Program
22 Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject
23 to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received
24 by the State Department of Health from:

1 1. Any state monies appropriated for the purpose of
2 implementing the provisions of the Oklahoma Organ Donor Education
3 and Awareness Program Act; and

4 2. Any monies collected pursuant to this section or any other
5 monies available to the State Department of Health to implement the
6 provisions of the Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and Awareness
7 Program Act.

8 B. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby
9 appropriated and shall be budgeted and expended to promote and
10 encourage organ donor education and awareness.

11 C. Monies credited to the fund, excluding administrative fees
12 paid to the Oklahoma Tax Commission, may be used for, but are not
13 limited to:

14 1. Administration of the Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and
15 Awareness Program Act, including, but not limited to, personnel and
16 Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and Awareness Program Advisory
17 Council expenses;

18 2. Development and promotion of organ donor public education
19 and awareness programs in cooperation with the Oklahoma Organ
20 Sharing Network including, but not limited to, the American Red
21 Cross and the Oklahoma Lions Eye Bank;

22 3. To assist in the publication of information pamphlets or
23 booklets by the State Department of Health and the State
24 Superintendent of Public Instruction regarding organ donation and

1 donations to the Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and Awareness
2 Program Revolving Fund. The State Department of Health shall
3 distribute such informational pamphlets or booklets to the
4 Department of Public Safety for distribution to applicants for
5 original, renewal, or replacement driver licenses and identification
6 cards when making a voluntary contribution pursuant to Section
7 2220.5 of this title and to the Oklahoma Tax Commission for
8 distribution to individuals when making a voluntary contribution
9 pursuant to the state income tax check off provided for in Section
10 2220.4 of this title;

11 4. Implementation of organ donor education and awareness
12 programs in the elementary and secondary schools of this state by
13 the State Department of Education in cooperation with the Oklahoma
14 Organ Donor Education and Awareness Program Advisory Council;

15 5. Grants by the State Department of Health to certified organ
16 procurement organizations for the development and implementation of
17 organ donor education and awareness programs in this state;

18 6. Encouraging the incorporation of organ donor information
19 into the medical and nursing school curriculums of the state's
20 medical and nursing schools. If funds are provided to a university
21 for this educational purpose, the university shall annually evaluate
22 the extent to which the curriculum has affected the attitudes of its
23 students and graduates with regard to organ donation and shall

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1 forward the evaluation results to the ~~State Department of Health~~
2 Advisory Council; and

3 7. A reserve fund in an interest-bearing account with five
4 percent (5%) of the monies received by the fund annually to be
5 placed in this account. No funds may be expended from the reserve
6 fund account until the required balance has reached One Hundred
7 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) and then these funds may only be used
8 in years when donations do not meet the average normal operating fee
9 incurred by the fund, and funds are expended to meet expenses. Once
10 the balance in the reserve fund account reaches One Hundred Thousand
11 Dollars (\$100,000.00), excess funds earned by interest, and yearly
12 allocations may be used at the discretion of the ~~State Department of~~
13 ~~Health~~ Advisory Council to cover operating costs and to provide
14 additional funds.

15 D. The fund may accept bequests and grants from individuals,
16 corporations, organizations, associations, and any other source.
17 The fund supplements and augments services provided by state
18 agencies and does not take the place of such services.

19 E. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants
20 issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by
21 law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
22 Services for approval and payment.

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1 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2220.5, as
2 amended by Section 77, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp. 2013,
3 Section 2220.5), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 2220.5. A. 1. An applicant for an original or
5 replacement driver license or identification card shall be given an
6 opportunity to make a voluntary contribution of One Dollar (\$1.00)
7 to be credited to the Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and Awareness
8 Program Revolving Fund established in Section 2220.3 of this title.
9 Any voluntary contribution shall be added to the driver license or
10 identification card fee and then be referred to the State Treasurer
11 and credited to the Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and Awareness
12 Program Revolving Fund as provided in Section 2220.3 of this title.

13 2. An applicant for a vehicle title or transfer of title or for
14 a vehicle license plate shall be given an opportunity to make a
15 minimum voluntary contribution of One Dollar (\$1.00) to be credited
16 to the Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and Awareness Program
17 Revolving Fund established in Section 2220.3 of this title. Any
18 voluntary contribution shall be added to the title or license plate
19 fee and then be referred to the State Treasurer and credited to the
20 Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and Awareness Program Revolving Fund
21 as provided in Section 2220.3 of this title.

22 3. The contribution prescribed in this section is voluntary and
23 may be refused by the applicant. The Department of Public Safety
24 and the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall make available an information

1 booklet or other informational sources on the importance of organ
2 donation to applicants for licensure, as designed and provided by
3 the State Department of Health and the State Superintendent of
4 Public Instruction with the assistance of the Oklahoma Organ Donor
5 Education and Awareness Program Advisory Council established in
6 Section 2220.2 of this title.

7 B. The Department of Public Safety and motor license agents
8 shall inquire of each applicant at the time of presentation of a
9 completed application for an original driver license or
10 identification card whether the applicant is interested in making
11 the One Dollar (\$1.00) contribution prescribed in subsection A of
12 this section and whether the applicant is interested in being an
13 organ and tissue donor. The Department of Public Safety or motor
14 license agents shall also specifically inform the applicant of the
15 ability to make an organ and tissue donation. The Department of
16 Public Safety shall notify the State Commissioner of Health of the
17 name, address, date of birth, and driver license number or
18 identification card number of applicants who indicate that they are
19 interested in being an organ donor.

20 C. The incremental cost of administration of contributions to
21 the fund, not to exceed one percent (1%) of the monies received
22 pursuant to the provisions of this section, shall be paid by the
23 fund to the Department of Public Safety or the Oklahoma Tax
24 Commission, as applicable, from amounts received pursuant to the

1 provisions of this section before funds are expended for the
2 purposes of the fund.

3 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2220.6, as
4 amended by Section 78, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp. 2013,
5 Section 2220.6), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 2220.6. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction
7 shall develop and implement in conjunction with the State Department
8 of Health and the Oklahoma Organ Donor Education and Awareness
9 Advisory Council within the State Department of Health an organ
10 donor education and awareness curriculum for use in the elementary
11 and secondary schools of this state. The State Board of Education
12 shall promulgate rules to enact the provisions of this section not
13 later than the 2001-2002 school year.

14 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2011, Section 1135.3, as
15 last amended by Section 2, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013 (47 O.S. Supp.
16 2013, Section 1135.3), is amended to read as follows:

17 Section 1135.3. A. The Oklahoma Tax Commission is hereby
18 authorized to design and issue appropriate official special license
19 plates to persons wishing to demonstrate support, interest, or
20 membership to or for an organization, occupation, cause or other
21 subject as provided by this section.

22 Special license plates shall not be transferred to any other
23 person but shall be removed from the vehicle upon transfer of
24 ownership and retained. The special license plate may then be used

1 on another vehicle but only after such other vehicle has been
2 registered for the current year.

3 Special license plates shall be renewed each year by the Tax
4 Commission or a motor license agent. The Tax Commission shall
5 annually notify by mail all persons issued special license plates.
6 The notice shall contain all necessary information and shall contain
7 instructions for the renewal procedure upon presentation to a motor
8 license agent or the Tax Commission. The license plates shall be
9 issued on a staggered system.

10 The Tax Commission is hereby directed to develop and implement a
11 system whereby motor license agents are permitted to accept
12 applications for special license plates authorized under this
13 section. The motor license agent shall confirm the applicant's
14 eligibility, if applicable, collect and deposit any amount
15 specifically authorized by law, accept and process the necessary
16 information directly into such system and generate a receipt
17 accordingly. For performance of these duties, motor license agents
18 shall retain the fee provided in Section 1141.1 of this title for
19 registration of a motor vehicle. The motor license agent fees for
20 acceptance of applications and renewals shall be paid out of the
21 Oklahoma Tax Commission Reimbursement Fund.

22 If fewer than one hundred of any type of special license plates
23 authorized prior to January 1, 2004, are issued prior to January 1,
24 2006, the Tax Commission shall discontinue issuance and renewal of

1 that type of special license plate. Any such authorized special
2 license plate registrant shall be allowed to display the license
3 plate upon the designated vehicle until the registration expiration
4 date. After such time the expired special license plate shall be
5 removed from the vehicle.

6 Except as otherwise provided in this section, for special
7 license plates authorized on or after July 1, 2004, no special
8 license plates shall be developed or issued by the Tax Commission
9 until the Commission receives one hundred (100) prepaid applications
10 therefor. The prepaid applications must be received by the Tax
11 Commission within one hundred and eighty (180) days of the effective
12 date of the authorization or the authority to issue shall be null
13 and void. In the event one hundred (100) prepaid applications are
14 not received by the Tax Commission within such prescribed time
15 period any payment so received shall be refunded accordingly.

16 B. The special license plates provided by this section are as
17 follows:

18 1. Round and Square Dance License Plates - such plates shall be
19 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for
20 round and square dancing;

21 2. National Association for the Advancement of Colored People
22 License Plates - such plates shall be designed, subject to the
23 criteria to be presented to the Tax Commission by the NAACP, and
24 issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for the NAACP;

1 3. National Rifle Association License Plates - such plates
2 shall be designed, subject to the criteria to be presented to the
3 Tax Commission by the National Rifle Association, and issued to any
4 person wishing to demonstrate support for the National Rifle
5 Association;

6 4. Masonic Fraternity License Plates - such plates shall be
7 designed and issued to any resident of this state who is a member of
8 a Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma. Such persons may apply for a
9 Masonic Fraternity license plate for each vehicle with a rated
10 carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less upon proof of a Masonic
11 Fraternity membership or upon the presentment of an application for
12 a Masonic Fraternity license plate authorized and approved by the
13 Grand Lodge of Oklahoma. The license plates shall be designed in
14 consultation with the Masonic Fraternities of Oklahoma and shall
15 contain the Masonic emblem;

16 5. Shriner's Hospitals for Burned and Crippled Children License
17 Plates - such plates shall be designed to demonstrate support for
18 Shriner's Hospitals for Burned and Crippled Children and shall be
19 issued to any resident of this state who is a member of a Shriner's
20 Temple in Oklahoma. The license plate shall be designed in
21 consultation with the Shriner's Temples in Oklahoma and shall
22 contain the Shriner's emblem;

1 6. Balloonists License Plate - such plates shall be designed
2 and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for hot air
3 ballooning in this state;

4 7. Order of the Eastern Star License Plates - such plates shall
5 be designed and issued to any resident of this state who is a member
6 of an Order of the Eastern Star. Such persons may apply for an
7 Order of the Eastern Star license plate for each vehicle with a
8 rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less upon proof of an
9 Order of the Eastern Star membership or upon the presentment of an
10 application for an Order of the Eastern Star license plate
11 authorized and approved by the organization. The license plate
12 shall be designed in consultation with the Order of the Eastern Star
13 and shall contain the Order of the Eastern Star emblem;

14 8. Knights of Columbus License Plates - such plates shall be
15 designed and issued to any resident of this state who is a member of
16 the Knights of Columbus. Such persons may apply for a Knights of
17 Columbus license plate for each vehicle with a rated carrying
18 capacity of one (1) ton or less upon proof of a Knights of Columbus
19 membership or upon the presentment of an application for a Knights
20 of Columbus license plate authorized and approved by the
21 organization. The license plate shall be designed in consultation
22 with the Knights of Columbus and shall contain the Knights of
23 Columbus emblem;

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1 9. Jaycees License Plates - such plates shall be designed and
2 issued to members of the Jaycees. Persons applying for such license
3 plate must show proof of membership in the Jaycees. The license
4 plates shall be designed in consultation with the Jaycees;

5 10. Ducks Unlimited License Plates - such plates shall be
6 designed and issued to members of Ducks Unlimited. Persons applying
7 for and renewing such license plates must show proof of tag
8 membership in Ducks Unlimited. The license plates shall be designed
9 in consultation with Ducks Unlimited;

10 11. Kiwanis International License Plates - such plates shall be
11 designed and issued to members of Kiwanis International. Persons
12 applying for such license plate must show proof of membership in
13 Kiwanis International. The license plates shall be designed in
14 consultation with Kiwanis International;

15 12. Certified Public Accountants License Plates - such plates
16 shall be designed and issued to any resident of this state who is a
17 Certified Public Accountant. Such persons may apply for a Certified
18 Public Accountant license plate for each vehicle with a rated
19 carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less upon proof of status as a
20 Certified Public Accountant. The license plates shall be designed
21 in consultation with the Oklahoma Society of Certified Public
22 Accountants;

1 13. Civil Emergency Management License Plates - such plates
2 shall be designed and issued to persons wishing to demonstrate
3 support for the state civil emergency management system;

4 14. Civilian Conservation Corps License Plates - such plates
5 shall be designed, subject to criteria to be presented to the Tax
6 Commission, by the Civilian Conservation Corps Association, and
7 issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support of the Civilian
8 Conservation Corps;

9 15. Rotarian License Plates - such plates shall be designed and
10 issued to any resident of this state who is a member of a Rotarian
11 Club of Oklahoma. Such persons may apply for a Rotarian license
12 plate for each vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton
13 or less upon proof of a Rotarian Club membership or upon the
14 presentment of an application for a Rotarian license plate
15 authorized and approved by a Rotarian Club of Oklahoma. The license
16 plates shall be designed in consultation with the five Rotarian
17 District Governors and shall contain the Rotarian emblem;

18 16. Benevolent Protective Order of Elks - such plates shall be
19 designed, subject to criteria to be presented to the Tax Commission,
20 by the Benevolent Protective Order of Elks, and issued to any
21 resident of this state who is a member of the Benevolent Protective
22 Order of Elks;

23 17. Humane Society License Plates - such plates shall be
24 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for

1 the Humane Society of the United States. The plates shall be issued
2 to any person in any combination of numbers and letters from one to
3 a maximum of seven, as for personalized license plates. The plate
4 shall contain the official Humane Society logo;

5 18. Oklahoma Mustang Club - such plates shall be designed,
6 subject to criteria to be presented to the Tax Commission, by the
7 Oklahoma Mustang Club, and issued to any resident of this state who
8 is a member of the Oklahoma Mustang Club. Such persons may apply
9 for an Oklahoma Mustang Club license plate upon presentment of proof
10 of membership in the Oklahoma Mustang Club. The plates shall be
11 issued to any person in any combination of numbers and letters from
12 one to a maximum of seven, as for personalized license plates;

13 19. American Business Clubs (AMBUCS) License Plates - such
14 plates shall be designed and issued to members of American Business
15 Clubs. Persons applying for such license plate must show proof of
16 membership in AMBUCS. The license plates shall be designed in
17 consultation with American Business Clubs;

18 20. West Point 200th Anniversary License Plates - such plates
19 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to commemorate
20 the Two Hundredth Anniversary of the founding of the United States
21 Military Academy at West Point, New York. The license plates shall
22 be designed in consultation with the West Point Society of Central
23 Oklahoma;

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1 21. Oklahoma Aquarium License Plate - such plates shall be
2 designed and issued to persons wishing to demonstrate support for
3 the Oklahoma Aquarium. The license plates shall be designed in
4 consultation with the Oklahoma Aquarium;

5 22. The Pride of Broken Arrow License Plates - such plates
6 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
7 support for The Pride of Broken Arrow marching band. The plates
8 shall be designed in consultation with the Broken Arrow Public
9 School System;

10 23. Fellowship of Christian Athletes License Plates - such
11 plates shall be designed in consultation with the Fellowship of
12 Christian Athletes and issued to members and supporters of the

17 designed and issued to persons wishing to demonstrate support and
18 increase awareness for organ, eye and tissue donation. The license

21 Advisory Council;

22 30. Central Oklahoma Habitat for Humanity License Plate - such
23 plates shall be designed and issued to persons wishing to

9 for the National Weather Center in Norman. The plates shall be
10 designed in consultation with representatives of the National
11 Weather Center Directors;

12 43. Make-A-Wish Foundation License Plate - such plates shall be
13 designed and issued to persons wishing to demonstrate support for
14 the Make-A-Wish Foundation. The license plates shall be designed in
15 consultation with the Oklahoma Chapter of the National Make-A-Wish

18 plates shall be designed and issued to persons wishing to

4 plates shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to

20 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for

24 be designed and issued to any person wishing to increase awareness

1 of ovarian cancer. The license plate shall be designed in

3 56. BMW Car Club of America License Plate - such plates shall
4 be designed and issued to any resident of this state who is a member
5 of the BMW Car Club of America. Such persons may apply for an BMW
6 Car Club of America license plate upon presentment of proof of
7 membership in the BMW Car Club of America. The plates shall be
8 issued to any person in any combination of numbers and letters from
9 one to a maximum of seven, as for personalized license plates. The
10 license plate shall be designed in consultation with the Sunbelt
11 Chapter of the BMW Car Club of America;

12 57. Deer Creek School District License Plates - such plates
13 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
14 support for the Deer Creek School District. The plates shall be
15 designed in consultation with representatives of the Deer Creek
16 School District; and

17 58. Don't Tread On Me License Plate - such plates shall be
18 designed to include the yellow background and rattlesnake emblem
19 above the motto "DON'T TREAD ON ME" as found on the historic Gadsden
20 flag, and shall be issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
21 support for the freedom and liberty of the Republic.

22 C. The fee for such plates shall be Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00)
23 and shall be in addition to all other registration fees provided by
24 the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act. Unless otherwise

1 provided in this section, the fee shall be apportioned as follows:
2 Eight Dollars (\$8.00) of the special license plate fee shall be
3 deposited in the Oklahoma Tax Commission Reimbursement Fund to be
4 used for the administration of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and
5 Registration Act and the remaining Seven Dollars (\$7.00) of the
6 special license plate fee shall be apportioned as provided in
7 Section 1104 of this title.

8 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
