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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public finance; creating the
8 Modernization of Self-Defense Act Application Process
9 of 2013; amending 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.24.1, as
10 amended by Section 357, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (62
11 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section 34.24.1), which relates to
12 the Oklahoma State Finance Act; modifying exemption
13 process to include certain license; providing for
14 noncodification; and providing an effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
17 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

18 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Modernization
19 of Self-Defense Act Application Process of 2013".

20 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.24.1, as
21 amended by Section 357, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (62 O.S. Supp.
22 2012, Section 34.24.1), is amended to read as follows:

23 Section 34.24.1 A. Except as otherwise provided by this
24 section, as of July 1, 2010, each state agency, board, commission or
other entity organized within the executive department of state
government responsible for licensing or permitting shall utilize the

1 portal system to allow for a link to a web-based application and
2 renewal application for any license or permit issued by that agency.
3 Access to the online renewal systems shall be featured prominently
4 on the portal system.

5 B. Each entity responsible for licensing or permitting shall
6 make available to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services
7 on a yearly basis a report describing the number of licenses issued,
8 license renewals and permits issued as well as an estimate of the
9 amount of savings incurred by the entity as a result of the online
10 licensing and permitting process.

11 C. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall make
12 available to the public a copy of each report submitted in
13 accordance with the requirements of subsection B of this section by
14 placing the report on the website defined in Section 46 of this
15 title.

16 D. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
17 Services may exempt a specific license or permit from the
18 requirements of this section should he find compelling evidence that
19 the issuance of the license or permit requires the provision of
20 information that cannot be provided through an online licensing or
21 permitting process and when the failure of the applicant to provide
22 the information would create a significant risk to the integrity of
23 the license or permit. The Director of the Office of Management and
24 Enterprise Services shall document any exemptions issued pursuant to

1 the provisions of this subsection and describe the compelling
2 evidence justifying the need for the exemptions in a report to be
3 provided to the Governor, Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
4 Representatives and Speaker Pro Tempore of the State Senate. The
5 exception provided for in this subsection shall not apply to license
6 renewals pursuant to the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration
7 Act of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes or to licenses issued
8 pursuant to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act.

9 E. The state agencies may accept an electronic signature in the
10 application process for any license or permit; provided, the use of
11 an electronic signature shall not create a significant risk to the
12 integrity of the license or permit.

13 F. Nothing in this section shall apply to driver license
14 renewal applications.

15 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
