6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to crimes and punishments; making
8 certain acts unlawful; providing penalties; defining
9 terms; providing for codification; and providing an
10 effective date.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1176 of Title 21, unless there
14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 A. It shall be unlawful for any person to disclose, with the
16 intent to cause emotional distress, any photograph, film, videotape,
17 recording or any other reproduction of the image of another person
18 whose intimate body parts are exposed or who is engaged in an act of
19 sexual penetration or sexual contact, unless that person has
20 consented to such disclosure.

21 B. Any person who violates the provisions of this section
22 shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony punishable by
23 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for a
24 term not to exceed five (5) years, or by a fine of Twenty-five

1 Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), or by both such fine and
2 imprisonment.

3 C. As used in this section:

4 1. "Disclose" means to sell, manufacture, give, provide, lend,
5 trade, mail, deliver, transfer, publish, distribute, circulate,
6 disseminate, present, exhibit, advertise or offer;

7 2. "Emotional distress" means significant mental suffering or
8 distress that may, but does not necessarily require, medical or
9 other professional treatment or counseling; and

10 3. "Intimate body parts" means any portion of the genitals,
11 pubic area, buttocks or any portion of the areola of the female
12 breast.

13 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
