6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public finance; enacting the
8 Federal Receipts Reporting Requirements Act;
9 prescribing procedures with regard to receipt and
10 reporting of federal funds; defining terms; imposing
11 reporting requirements on executive branch entities;
12 imposing duties upon the Office of Management and
13 Enterprise Services; requiring reports to the
14 Appropriations and Budget Committee of the Oklahoma
15 House of Representatives and the Appropriations
16 Committee of the Oklahoma State Senate; requiring
17 committee meetings; authorizing actions by
18 committees; providing for codification; providing an
19 effective date; and declaring an emergency.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9001 of Title 62, unless there
23 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

24 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Federal
Receipts Reporting Requirements Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9002 of Title 62, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 As used in this section:

2 1. "Designated state agency" means any agency, board,
3 commission, department or other entity organized within the
4 executive branch of state government;

5 2. "Designated state agency" does not include the judicial
6 branch, the legislative branch, or an office or other entity within
7 the judicial branch or the legislative branch;

8 3. "Political subdivision" means any county, city, town, school
9 district or other local government entity;

10 4. "Federal receipts" means the federal financial assistance,
11 as defined in 31 U.S.C., Section 7501, that is reported as part of a
12 single audit; and

13 5. "Single audit" is as defined in 31 U.S.C., Section 7501.

14 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9003 of Title 62, unless there
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. Designated state agencies and political subdivisions shall
18 each year, on or before October 31, prepare a report that:

19 1. Reports the aggregate value of federal receipts the
20 designated state agency or political subdivision received for the
21 preceding fiscal year;

22 2. Reports the aggregate amount of federal funds appropriated
23 by the Legislature to the designated state agency or political
24 subdivision for the preceding fiscal year;

1 3. Calculates the percentage that constitutes federal receipts
2 of the total budget for the designated state agency or political
3 subdivision received for that fiscal year; and

4 4. Develops a plan for operating the designated state agency or
5 political subdivision if there is a reduction of:

6 a. five percent (5%) or more in the federal receipts that
7 the designated state agency or political subdivision
8 receives, and

9 b. twenty-five percent (25%) or more in the federal
10 receipts that the designated state agency or political
11 subdivision receives.

12 B. The designated state agencies and political subdivisions
13 shall submit the report to the Office of Management and Enterprise
14 Services on or before November 1 of each year.

15 C. 1. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall,
16 on or before November 30 of each year, prepare a report that:

17 a. compiles and summarizes the reports the Office of
18 Management and Enterprise Services receives in
19 accordance with paragraph 2 of subsection A of this
20 section, and

21 b. compares the aggregate value of federal receipts each
22 designated state agency and political subdivision
23 received for the previous fiscal year to the aggregate
24 amount of federal funds to the total budget of the

1 designated state agency or political subdivision for
2 that fiscal year.

3 2. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall, as
4 part of the report required by paragraph 1 of this subsection,
5 compile a list of designated state agencies and political
6 subdivisions that do not submit a report as required by this
7 section.

8 D. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
9 submit the report required by paragraph 2 of subsection C of this
10 section to the Appropriations and Budget Committee of the Oklahoma
11 House of Representatives and the Appropriations Committee of the
12 Oklahoma State Senate on or before December 1 of each year.

13 E. Upon receipt of the report required by subsection D of this
14 section, the chairs of the House Appropriations and Budget Committee
15 and the Senate Appropriations Committee shall place the report on
16 the agenda for review and consideration at the next regularly
17 scheduled or special meeting of the respective committee.

18 F. When considering the report required by subsection D of this
19 section, the respective committee may elect to:

20 1. Recommend that the Legislature reduce or eliminate
21 appropriations for a designated state agency or political
22 subdivision;

23 2. Take no action; or

1 3. Take another action that a majority of the committee
2 approves.

3 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2014.

4 SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
6 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
