7 AS INTRODUCED

8 A Resolution opposing recognition in state of certain
9 term; opposing any group that integrates certain
10 term; opposing recognition in state of certain
11 alliances; opposing certain national or international
12 pacts; and directing distribution.

13 WHEREAS, the United Nations Agenda 21 is a comprehensive plan of
14 environmental extremism, social engineering and global political
15 control that was initiated at the United Nations Conference on
16 Environment and Development held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, in 1992;
17 and

18 WHEREAS, the United Nations Agenda 21 is being covertly pushed
19 into local communities throughout the United States through the
20 International Council of Local Environmental Initiatives through
21 local "sustainability" policies such as Smart Growth, Wildlands
22 Project, Resilient Cities, Regional Visioning Projects and other
23 "Green" or "Alternative" projects; and

1 WHEREAS, this United Nations Agenda 21 plan of radical
2 "sustainability" views the American way of life of private-property
3 ownership, single-family homes, private-car ownership, individual
4 travel choices and privately owned farms as destructive to the
5 environment; and

6 WHEREAS, the Oklahoma House of Representatives recognizes the
7 harmful implications of the implementation of United Nations Agenda
8 21's destructive strategies for "sustainability" and desires the
9 rejection of its radical policy in our state.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
11 OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 54TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

12 THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives opposes the
13 recognition in our state of any term like "sustainability", which
14 has no solid universal definition and can be manipulated to enforce
15 overreaching regulations that incrementally aid in destroying
16 America's grassroots production agriculturists ability to operate,
17 increasing production costs and over-regulating energy production.

18 THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives opposes any group,
19 individual or program that integrates the term "sustainability", or
20 any related term like "carbon footprint" or "trip bottom line" that
21 hinder production agriculture's ability to efficiently and feasibly
22 feed the nation and the world.

23 THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives opposes the
24 recognition in our state of any national or international pacts,

1 alliances or agreements, such as the TPP Trans Pacific Partnership
2 or Global Roundtable for Sustainable Beef, in which overreaching
3 regulations, including expansion of endangered species, unreasonable
4 EPA regulations, or the use of terms such as "sustainability" or any
5 other ideas extending from extreme environmentalists that would
6 incrementally aid in destroying America's grassroots production
7 agriculturists' ability to operate feasibly and efficiently.

8 THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives opposes any and all
9 national or international pacts, alliances and agreements that would
10 negatively affect the ability of our nation's farmers and ranchers
11 to efficiently and feasibly feed the nation and world by increasing
12 production costs such as increased energy costs due to these
13 regulations.

14 THAT a copy of this resolution be sent to the Oklahoma
15 Congressional Delegation, the Speaker of the United States House of
16 Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the United States
17 Senate.
