8 A Resolution proclaiming Girl Scout Day in Oklahoma;
9 and applauding the commitment Girl Scouting has made
10 to the development of leadership.

12 WHEREAS, this year marked the 102nd Anniversary of Girl Scouts
13 of the USA, founded by Juliette Gordon Low in 1912, in Savannah,
14 Georgia; and

15 WHEREAS, throughout its distinguished history, Girl Scouting has
16 inspired millions of girls and women with courage, confidence and
17 character to make the world a better place; and

18 WHEREAS, through the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, girls
19 develop the skills and lessons that will serve them throughout their
20 lives so that they may contribute to their communities; and

21 WHEREAS, Girl Scouting takes an active role in increasing girls'
22 awareness of the opportunities in mathematics, science, sports,
23 technology, and many fields of interest that can expand their
24 horizons; and

1 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts in Oklahoma is actively addressing the
2 needs of girls in our state through a leadership program that builds
3 self-esteem and confidence to address challenges for girls in our
4 state, including dropout rates, births to teenagers, obesity, and
5 poverty; and

6 WHEREAS, the State of Oklahoma acknowledges and applauds the
7 efforts of Girl Scouts in our state, as Girls Scouts celebrate 102
8 years of providing leadership so that the future women of Oklahoma
9 will be confident and skilled leaders of tomorrow; and

10 WHEREAS, millions of Girl Scout members nationwide and thousands
11 of girls in Oklahoma will be celebrating this American tradition,
12 and welcoming girls from every background to join; and

13 WHEREAS, hundreds of Girl Scouts from across our state are at
14 the Capitol today celebrating 102 years and advocating on behalf of
15 girls; and

16 WHEREAS, several women elected to public office in Oklahoma will
17 be pinned today as members of the honorary Troop 1912 in Oklahoma -
18 including some in our Chamber today.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
20 OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 54TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

21 THAT March 19, 2014, is hereby proclaimed Girl Scout Day in
22 Oklahoma.
