6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to construction industries; amending
8 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1000.2, which relates to the
9 Construction Industries Board; clarifying language;
10 and providing an effective date.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1000.2, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 1000.2. A. The Construction Industries Board is hereby
15 created to continue until July 1, 2013, in accordance with the
16 provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law. ~~Beginning January 1, 2002,~~
17 ~~the~~ The Board shall regulate the plumbing, electrical and mechanical
18 trades, and building and construction inspectors through the powers
19 and duties set forth in the Construction Industries Board Act and in
20 the respective licensing acts for such trades.

21 B. 1. Beginning July 1, 2008, the Board shall be composed of
22 seven (7) members appointed by the Governor with the advice and
23 consent of the Senate, as follows:

- 1 a. two members shall have at least ten (10) years'
2 experience in the plumbing trade, of which one shall
3 be a plumbing contractor and one shall be a journeyman
4 plumber,
- 5 b. two members shall have at least ten (10) years'
6 experience in the electrical trade, of which one shall
7 be an electrical contractor and one shall be a
8 journeyman electrician,
- 9 c. two members shall have at least ten (10) years'
10 experience in the mechanical trade, of which one shall
11 be a mechanical contractor and one shall be a
12 mechanical journeyman, and
- 13 d. one member shall have at least ten (10) years'
14 experience as a building and construction inspector
15 and shall be from a list recommended by a statewide
16 organization of municipal governments.

17 2. Members shall be appointed for terms of four (4) years;
18 provided, of those members initially appointed to the Board, five
19 members shall be appointed for two-year terms, beginning September
20 1, 2001, and four members shall be appointed for four-year terms,
21 beginning September 1, 2001, as designated by the Governor. Members
22 shall continue in office until a successor is appointed by the
23 Governor. The Governor shall fill all vacancies and unexpired terms
24 in the same manner as the original appointment of the member whose

1 position is to be filled. Such members may be removed by the
2 Governor for cause.

3 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.

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
