6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to the Alternative Fuels Technician
8 Certification Act; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section
9 130.20, which relates to work of technician by
10 noncertified person; providing exception for persons
11 modifying their own vehicle; stating restriction;
12 providing punishment for violations; and declaring an
13 emergency.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 130.20, is
16 amended to read as follows:

17 Section 130.20. A. After September 1, 1991, it shall be
18 unlawful for any person to perform the work or offer, by
19 advertisement or otherwise, to perform the work of an alternative
20 fuels equipment technician until such person has qualified and is
21 certified as an alternative fuels equipment technician.

22 B. Beginning September 1, 1995, it shall be unlawful for any
23 person to perform work or offer, by advertisement or otherwise, to
24 perform the work of an alternative fuels compression technician

1 until such person has qualified and is certified as an alternative
2 fuels compression technician.

3 C. Beginning November 1, 1998, it shall be unlawful for any
4 person to perform the work or offer, by advertisement or otherwise,
5 to perform the work of an electric vehicle technician until such
6 person has qualified and is certified as an electric vehicle
7 technician. Electric vehicles that have a manufacturer's warranty
8 shall be serviced by an authorized new car dealer. Any vehicle
9 manufacturer's training center located in the state, which offers
10 alternative fuel and electric vehicle courses meeting new car
11 manufacturing requirements, shall be exempted from this act.

12 D. ~~Provided, nothing~~ Nothing in the Alternative Fuels
13 Technician Certification Act shall be construed to prohibit a
14 noncertified person from converting the engine of a farm tractor, as
15 defined in Section 1-118 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to an
16 engine fueled by alternative fuels, as long as such farm tractor is
17 not operated on the roads and highways of this state.

18 E. Nothing in the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification
19 Act shall be construed to prohibit any person from converting the
20 engine of his or her own vehicle to an engine fueled by alternative
21 fuels, provided the vehicle is not offered for future resale or
22 trade-in without disclosure of such conversion performed not in
23 compliance with the requirements of this act. Any person found in
24

1 violation of this subsection shall be subject to punishment as
2 provided in Section 130.23 of this title.

3 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
4 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
5 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
6 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
