6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to schools; creating a task force to  
8 study the effectiveness of the School for the Deaf;  
9 stating purpose; providing for membership; providing  
10 for appointment of chair; providing for meetings;  
11 prohibiting compensation; providing for travel  
12 reimbursement; requiring completion of study by  
13 certain date; providing for submission of  
14 recommendations; providing for noncodification;  
15 providing an effective date; and declaring an  
16 emergency.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
19 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

20 A. There is hereby created until December 14, 2014, a task  
21 force to study the effectiveness of the School for the Deaf.

22 B. The task force shall consist of nine (9) members, three (3)  
23 members to be appointed by the Governor, three (3) members to be  
24 appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and three (3)  
members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
Representatives.

C. The Governor shall appoint the chair of the task force.

1 D. The task force shall be authorized to meet at such times as  
2 may be required in order to fulfill the duties imposed upon the task  
3 force by law.

4 E. Members of the task force shall receive no compensation for  
5 serving on the task force but shall receive travel reimbursement as  
6 follows:

7 1. State employees who are members of the task force shall be  
8 reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in the performance of their  
9 duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the State  
10 Travel Reimbursement Act; and

11 2. Legislative members shall be reimbursed in accordance with  
12 Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

13 F. The task force shall complete its study not later than  
14 December 14, 2014. The task force shall submit its recommendations  
15 to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the  
16 President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2014.

18 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
19 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
20 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
21 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
