6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public health and safety; amending
8 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-105e, which relates to the
9 State Department of Health; clarifying statutory
10 reference; and providing an effective date.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-105e, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 1-105e. A. The State Department of Health shall:

15 1. Perform duties and responsibilities as directed by the State
16 Commissioner of Health to ensure compliance with relevant provisions
17 of ~~this act~~ Section 1-101 et seq. of this title;

18 2. Fix and collect fees for the certification of compliance of
19 health maintenance organizations pursuant to the provisions of
20 Section 6907 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

21 3. Perform any and all health-related services, within the
22 scope of practice, as prescribed by state law, by the State Board of
23 Health, or by standards of care for medical services. When the
24 Department provides a health-related service to any person covered

1 by an applicable health insurance plan, the Department may submit a
2 claim for said service to the appropriate insurance company, health
3 maintenance organization or preferred provider organization. Upon
4 receipt of the claim, said insurance company, health maintenance
5 organization or preferred provider organization shall reimburse the
6 Department for the service provided in accordance with the standard
7 and customary rate schedule established by the plan. All health
8 insurance plans doing business in Oklahoma shall recognize the
9 public health service delivery model utilized by the Department, as
10 an appropriate provider of services for reimbursement.

11 B. All actions of the Department shall be subject to the
12 provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act.

13 C. Fees and insurance reimbursement payments collected shall be
14 deposited in the Public Health Special Fund in the State Treasury.

15 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.

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
