10 COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

11 An Act relating to state employee compensation;
12 providing for salary increases for certain state
13 employees; defining terms; providing for employees on
14 leave without pay on certain date; providing for
15 certain reinstated or reemployed employees; providing
16 limitations; providing for classified employees to
17 receive increase if pay band maximum exceeded;
18 prohibiting expenditure of funds appropriated for
19 purpose of implementing pay increase for certain
20 purpose; providing for construction of certain
21 provisions; providing for noncodification; providing
22 an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

24 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

A. Effective July 1, 2014, full-time employees specified in
subsection B of this section, including temporary and other limited-
term employees of the state, who were employed by the state on the

1 last working day of June 2014, shall be awarded an annualized salary
2 increase equal to six and one-quarter percent (6.25%) of the
3 officer's or employee's annualized salary as of June 30, 2014.
4 Effective July 1, 2014, full-time employees specified in subsection
5 C of this section, including temporary and other limited-term
6 employees of the state, who were employed by the state on the last
7 working day of June 2014, shall be awarded an annualized salary
8 increase equal to eight percent (8%) of the officer's or employee's
9 annualized salary as of June 30, 2014.

10 B. The provisions of this section shall apply to the following:

11 1. Employees of the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement

6 C. The provisions of this section shall apply to employees of
7 the State Department of Corrections with the job titles of:

- 8 1. Correctional Security Officer I, II, III and IV;
- 9 2. Correctional Security Manager I and II; and
- 10 3. Chief of Security I, II and III.

11 D. As used in this section, "temporary and other limited-term
12 employees" are those persons who:

- 13 1. Are not permanent employees;
- 14 2. Are not otherwise excluded by this section; and
- 15 3. Are compensated by an agency, board, commission, department
16 or other employing entity for a limited duration and without any
17 subjective expectation by either the employer or the employee that
18 the employment will become permanent.

19 E. Employees eligible for the increase provided for in
20 subsection A of this section who are on leave without pay on July 1,
21 2014, shall receive an annualized increase, effective upon their
22 return to work, but shall not receive any increase for a period of
23 time prior to their return to work.

1 F. Employees who leave the state service before July 1, 2014,
2 and who are reinstated or reemployed in the state service during
3 July 2014, without a break in service, who are otherwise eligible
4 for the pay increase provided for in this section, shall be granted
5 such raise effective immediately upon such reinstatement or
6 reemployment. As used in this subsection, "break in service" is
7 defined as a period of time in excess of thirty (30) calendar days
8 between two periods of state employment.

9 G. No salary increase pursuant to this section shall be made
10 that exceeds a salary limitation provided in an agency's annual
11 appropriation bill or that exceeds the recommendations of the 2013
12 State Employee Total Remuneration Study. Classified employees
13 eligible for the salary increase provided for in this section shall
14 receive such increase even if it causes the employee's salary to
15 exceed the maximum for the employee's pay band.

16 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
17 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

18 No funds appropriated for the purpose of implementing the pay
19 increase provided in Section 1 of this act shall be expended by any
20 employing public agency, board, commission or other public employing
21 entity in order to increase compensation for persons employed by a
22 private business entity that has entered into a contract with the
23 public employing entity to provide personnel services or temporary
24 services to the public employing entity in order for the public

1 employing entity to perform duties imposed upon it by law or
2 functions which the public employing entity is authorized to perform
3 by law. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to
4 prohibit increases in compensation to a vendor performing other
5 types of services pursuant to a sole source contract or contract
6 awarded pursuant to The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act.

7 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2014.

8 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
9 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
10 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
11 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
