HB 1351 by Cooksey of the House and Treat of the Senate was read and considered.

Representative Echols moved to amend **HB 1351**, Page 43, Section 2, Line 9 by deleting the word "and"; Page 43, Section 2, Line 16 ½ by adding a new paragraph 52 to read as follows:

“; and 52. Lupus Awareness and Education License Plate - such plates shall be issued to any person wishing to provide financial support for the Lupus Foundation of Oklahoma. The license plates shall be designed in consultation with the Lupus Foundation of Oklahoma. As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Lupus License Plate Revolving Fund created in Section 4 of this act”; and by inserting on Page 45 a new Section 4 to read as follows, and by renumbering subsequent section:

“SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1104.24 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) of the fee authorized by Section 1135.5 of this title for Lupus Awareness and Education license plates shall be deposited to the Oklahoma Lupus License Plate Revolving Fund created in subsection B of this section.

B. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund to be designated the 'Oklahoma Lupus License Plate Revolving Fund' and administered by the State Department of Health. The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the State Department of Health pursuant to the provisions of subsection A of this section. All monies accruing to the credit of such fund are hereby appropriated and shall be budgeted and expended by the State Department of Health for the purpose of providing grants to the Lupus Foundation of Oklahoma for the purpose of lupus awareness, education, outreach, referral, research or treatment in this state. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

C. The Oklahoma Legislature hereby finds that the Lupus Foundation of Oklahoma provides an important service to the inhabitants of this state as a community and further finds that the services performed by the Lupus Foundation of Oklahoma are adequate consideration for the funds received pursuant to this section.”,

which amendment was declared adopted.

Representative Dorman moved to amend **HB 2232** by inserting a new Section 2 to read as follows, and by renumbering subsequent section:

“SECTION 2. A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes to read as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Lupus Foundation of Oklahoma Income Tax Checkoff Act of 2013.”

Representative Dorman moved to amend the amendment by deleting all language and by inserting a new Section 2 to read as follows:

“SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 2368.24, as amended by Section 564, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (68 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section 2368.24), is amended to read as follows:

Section 2368.24 A. Each state individual income tax return form for tax years which begin after December 31, ~~2011~~ 2012, and each state corporate tax return form for tax years beginning after December 31, ~~2011~~ 2012, shall contain a provision to allow a donation from a tax refund for the benefit of the ~~Oklahoma Lupus Revolving Fund~~ for Oklahoma.

B. Except as otherwise provided for in this section, all monies generated pursuant to subsection A of this section shall be paid to the State Treasurer by the Oklahoma Tax Commission and placed to the credit of the ~~Oklahoma Lupus Revolving Fund~~ for Oklahoma created in subsection C of this section.

C. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund to be designated the "~~Oklahoma Lupus Revolving Fund~~ for Oklahoma" and administered by the State Department of Health. The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all the monies received by the State Department of Health pursuant to the provisions of subsection A of this section. All monies accruing to the credit

of the fund are hereby appropriated and ~~may~~ shall be budgeted and expended by the State Department of Health at the beginning of each fiscal year for the purpose of providing grants to the ~~Oklahoma Medical Research~~ Lupus Foundation of Oklahoma for the purpose of ~~funding research into treating and curing Lupus~~ lupus awareness, education, outreach, referral, research or treatment in this state. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

D. If a taxpayer makes a donation pursuant to subsection A of this section in error, such taxpayer may file a claim for a refund at any time within three (3) years from the due date of the tax return. Such claims shall be filed pursuant to the provisions of Section 2373 of this title. Prior to the apportionment set forth in this section, an amount equal to the total amount of refunds made pursuant to this subsection during any one (1) year shall be deducted from the total donations received pursuant to this section during the following year and such amount deducted shall be paid to the State Treasurer and placed to the credit of the Income Tax Withholding Refund Account.”,

MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of **SBs 7, 16, 71, 72, 80, 216, 235, 357, 486, 487, 489, 519, 527, 578, 667, 716, 838, 1036, 1053, 1062, 1068, 1080, 1102** and **1103**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 7 – By Allen of the Senate and Murphey of the House.

An Act relating to state-owned properties; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 61.7, as last amended by Section 705, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section 61.7), which relates to the Oklahoma State Government Asset Reduction and Cost Savings Program; modifying procedures for sale or transfer of certain state properties; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 129.4, as amended by Section 818, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section 129.4), which relates to procedures for disposal of state property; providing for certain state agency to dispose of real property; modifying certain procedures; modifying certain notice requirements; modifying property value amount for sale of certain properties; stating exception; providing for monies to be deposited in certain revolving funds; stating exception; and providing an effective date.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 14-103G, which relates to oversize annual permits; providing for certain annual permit option; limiting load size axles; requiring vehicle identification number to be on permit; setting fee; providing for certain delivery of permit; providing for certain replacement; and declaring an emergency.

[crimes against animals - prohibited acts against a police dog or a police horse - effective date]

SB 80 – By Crain of the Senate and Dorman of the House.

An Act relating to absentee ballots; amending 26 O.S. 2011, Sections 14-123 and 14-125, which relate to counting of absentee ballots; allowing procedure to begin at earlier date or time; requiring approval of Secretary of State Election Board; setting forth procedures; prohibiting disclosure of results before certain date and time; providing for security of election results storage media; specifying certain duties of county election board and county sheriff; providing for feature of office or position for unauthorized disclosure; and providing an effective date.

SB 216 – By Fields of the Senate and Vaughan of the House.

An Act relating to game and fish; requiring certain license for certain persons; requiring the Department of Wildlife Conservation to promulgate certain rules; setting fee; stating exemptions; setting penalties; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 235 – By Simpson of the Senate and Hardin of the House.

[soldiers and sailors - modifying terms and qualifications - management and control of Oklahoma Veterans Home - repealer - effective date]

SB 357 – By Fields of the Senate and DeWitt of the House.
