“8. School districts shall provide for negotiations between school employees and school districts as set forth in Sections 509.1 through 509.11 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;”

Representative Hickman moved to amend the amendment by changing the word and number “paragraph 8” to “paragraphs 8 and 9” on the first line of the amendment; and by adding the following language after the fourth line of the amendment: “9. School districts shall comply with the dismissal and due process procedures for education support employees as set forth in Sections 6-101.40 through 6-101.47;”, which amendment was declared adopted.

Representative Hoskin moved to amend **HB 2131**, Page 10, Section 5, Line 14 by deleting all of the language beginning with the word “may” through the word “district” on Line 16 and by inserting in lieu thereof the following language: “shall accept student applications for transfer at any time during the school year”.

Representative Hickman moved to amend the Hoskin amendment by adding after the word “year” of the new language in the amendment the following language: “, but may include in the policy deadlines for when applications for transfers must be received by the school district prior to the beginning of a semester in order for the student to transfer and begin classes in that particular semester”; and by inserting on Page 8, Line 22 of the bill after the word “year” and before the period “.” the following language: “, subject to the policy of the receiving school district”, which amendment was declared adopted.
