MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of **SBs 309, 461, 592, 596, 767, 887, 889, 965** and **1058**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 309 – By Holt of the Senate and Banz of the House.

An Act relating to Presidential Electors; amending 26 O.S. 2011, Sections 10-102 and 10-108, which relate to oaths and vacancies of Presidential Electors; providing that refusal or failure to vote for certain persons deemed violation of oath of office; providing for forfeiture of office and filling of vacancy; and providing an effective date.

SB 461 – By Holt of the Senate and Brumbaugh of the House.

An Act relating to state purchasing; amending 61 O.S. 2011, Section 102, as amended by Section 311, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (61 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section 102), which relates to the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974; defining term; amending 61 O.S. 2011, Section 103, as amended by Section 312, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (61 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section 103), which relates to solicitation and award of contracts; prohibiting awarding of certain public construction contracts with certain purchasing cooperatives; stating exception; prohibiting certain purchasing cooperatives bidding on certain public construction contracts; stating exception; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 85.2, which relates to the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act; defining term; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 85.7, as amended by Section 738, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section 85.7), which relates to competitive bidding procedures; prohibiting use of certain contracts without compliance with the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act; stating application; and providing an effective date.

SB 592 – By Holt of the Senate and Schwartz of the House.

An Act relating to public health and safety; permitting assisted living facilities to participate in informal dispute resolution panels; authorizing the Oklahoma State Department of Health to appoint members to informal dispute resolution panels; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 596 – By Holt of the Senate and Murphey of the House.

An Act relating to state government; amending 62 O.S. 2011, Section 45.8, which relates to requiring evaluation of certain report in certain performance audits; requiring annual report to certain legislative committees and state agency by certain date; stating required information; stating procedures for developing report; defining terms; requiring posting of certain reports on certain agency website; requiring notice of posting; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 767 – By Marlatt of the Senate and Jackson of the House.

An Act relating to marginal oil and gas wells; transferring duties, assets and obligations of the Commission on Marginally Producing Oil and Gas Wells to the Committee for Sustaining Oklahoma's Energy Resources on certain date; terminating employees and appointments of Commission members by certain date; stating procedures; transferring

authority for certain functions; transferring monies in certain revolving funds; authorizing rulemaking; providing for assistance by the Secretary of Energy; amending 52 O.S. 2011, Sections 288.5A and 288.5B, as amended by Section 214, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (52 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section 288.5B), which relate to the Sustaining Oklahoma's Energy Resources Committee and Revolving Fund; creation of advisory committee for certain purposes; modifying duties of committee; modifying purposes of fund; amending 52 O.S. 703, which relates to levying fees for the Commission on Marginally Producing Oil and Gas Wells; transferring fees to certain Committee; modifying statutory references; amending 52 O.S. 2011, Section 704, which relates to fee refund procedures; transferring duty to refund fees to certain Committee; repealing 52 O.S. 2011, Sections 700, 701, 702, 705, as amended by Section 220, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012, 706 and 707 (52 O.S. Supp. 2012, Section 705), which relate to the Commission on Marginally Producing Oil and Gas Wells; providing for codification; providing for recodification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 887 – By Holt and Standridge of the Senate and Grau of the House.

[poor persons - penalties for fraud - extending periods of incarceration for convictions - effective date]

SB 889 – By Holt of the Senate and Schwartz of the House.

An Act relating to sex offender registration; amending 57 O.S. 2011, Section 583, which relates to time limit and duration; modifying time periods for certain registration requirements; requiring maintenance of certain records; and providing an effective date.

SB 965 – By Marlatt, Fields and Ivester of the Senate and Jackson of the House.

[Oklahoma Water Resources Board - modifying appointments to the Board based on regional representation -emergency]

SB 1058 – By Schulz of the Senate and Ortega of the House.

[consumer sales and loans - refund and credit - gender neutral - initiate certain refund or credit - prohibiting retention - effective date]
