Forty-ninth Legislative Day, Monday, April 29, 2013

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Jackson.

The roll was called with 98 Members present.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Enrolled House Joint Resolution No. **1023**

By: Nollan, et al of the House and Griffin, et al of the Senate

This is to advise you that on this date, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 11 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution to approve or object to legislation presented to me, I have VETOED House Joint Resolution **1023**.

The State of Oklahoma currently has hundreds of agencies, boards, and commissions. One of my focuses since taking office has been to streamline government, reduce the number of entities, and to create a more efficient and accountable state government.

While possible reform of Oklahoma's juvenile justice system is an important issue worthy of review, this issue can be addressed by establishing the Oklahoma Juvenile Justice Reform Committee through executive order, rather than passing legislation and adding statutory provisions to our already lengthy legal code. Creation of this committee through an executive order will ensure the committee is productive, fully serves its purpose, and has a final end date.

This legislation also inadvertently creates an additional financial burden to state agencies by requiring them to provide mileage reimbursements to committee members.

House Joint Resolution **1023** is not consistent with my commitment to reducing the size and cost of state government.
