Six percent (6%) for the 2014 tax year and any subsequent tax year unless the rate prescribed by paragraph 2 of this subsection is in effect; or 2. Five percent (5%) for tax year 2016 and subsequent tax years. The decrease in the corporate income tax rate otherwise authorized by this paragraph shall be contingent upon the determination required to be made by the State Board of Equalization pursuant to Section 4 of this act”; and by inserting a new Section 4, and renumbering subsequent sections, which amendment was declared adopted.

Representative Sears moved to amend **HB 2508** by restoring the title, which amendment was declared adopted upon a division of the question.
