Representative Floyd raised a point of order as to whether it was in order for the House to consider a bill that would repeal a state statute previously adopted by statewide initiative petition. The Presiding Officer ruled that in reliance on *House Precedent* 14.2-1 (2007), and the guidance provided in Section 578(6) of *Mason's Manual of Legislative Procedure*, the Presiding Officer would not presume to speak in place of the House and would leave determination of constitutionality up to the House itself.

Representative Sherrer appealed the ruling of the Presiding Officer receiving the required 15 seconds.

“The question is, shall the decision of the Presiding Officer be the decision of the House? All those in favor signify by voting ‘Aye’; those opposed ‘Nay’. The vote is now in progress.”
