Research Analysis

The CS for HB 1094 creates the Home Bakery Act of 2013, which defines “home food establishment.” The measure exempts a home food establishment from the licensing requirements of the State Department of Health, but the Department is permitted to request documentation to verify the gross annual sales of the establishment. Additionally, the measure specifies labeling requirements of home food establishment products. Any violation of the act will result in a misdemeanor and a fine no greater than \$100. Finally, the measure does not prevent counties from enacting ordinances related to home food establishments as long as they do not conflict with the act.
