**Research Analysis**

HB 1293 allows a court to enter a written order requiring the Department of Public Safety to stay actions against the Class D driving privileges of a person whose license has been suspended, revoked, canceled or denied if the court determines that no other means of transportation for the offender is available. Allows a court to enter a written order requiring the Department of Public Safety to restore the Class D driving privileges of a person who has completed all terms and conditions of a community punishment if the suspension or revocation is not related to any drug or alcohol related offense other than the one the offender is serving punishment for and the offender has paid all reinstatement fees and met all conditions for reinstatement.
