Research Analysis

The committee substitute to House Bill 1756 allows students with disabilities who are assessed with alternate achievement standards through the Oklahoma Alternate Assessment Program and fail to meet graduation testing requirements to graduate with a standard diploma if the school district determines that they meet certain standards. Those students must obtain a written recommendation from their teacher in the subject areas where they failed to meet graduation testing requirements. The recommendation must include support from the principal and documentation demonstrating acquired knowledge through alternate measures. The student also must complete remediation required by the individualized education program, retake the exams failed if the IEP requires retakes, maintain a C average in subjects in which they failed to meet graduation testing requirements, and meet all other graduation requirements of the district.
