The committee substitute for HB1835 makes the first and second offence of possession of marijuana a misdemeanor. Currently, the second offense is a felony. HB1835 would save \$46 per day in prison costs for persons convicted of a second possession of marijuana offense who would have otherwise been given a term of incarceration.
