**Fiscal Analysis**

In 2012 the Health Care Authority (OHCA) paid 1,095 claims related to the “morning-after-pill” at a state cost of \$42,095. Assuming utilization is comparable in future years, discontinuing reimbursement for the morning-after-pill, should result in a savings to the state of approximately \$40,000 - 45,000
