Research Analysis

The committee substitute allows school districts to submit requests to the State Board of Education for exemption from all statutory requirements and State Board of Education rules from which charter schools are exempt. Requests must include plans for deregulation which outline the goals sought, the educational and fiscal benefits of deregulation and the anticipated outcomes. The state board must approve or disapprove the request within 60 days of receipt. School districts may resubmit an amended request after denial. Plans must be for no longer than three years. The school district may apply for renewal prior to the beginning of the third year. Districts must submit annual reports and the state board must assess academic achievement and fiscal status annually. Students who reside in the school district will be entitled to attend the school. School districts must meet the minimum salary schedule for teachers and provide health insurance for employees. Employees will participate in the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma and will submit to criminal history record check requirements. Districts will evaluate teachers, comply with dismissal and due process procedures for teachers and administrators and make payroll deductions for professional organization dues and political contributions at the request of employees. Districts must meet curriculum, testing and certification requirements. Districts must provide for negotiation between employees and the district, require schools to observe one minute of silence each day and require members of boards of education to meet continuing education requirements. Districts also must meet all reporting requirements.
