**Research Analysis**

HB 2099 creates the Children with Disabilities Comprehensive Systems of Services Fund Act of 2013 and creates the Oklahoma Children’s Comprehensive Systems of Services Board. The duties of the Board will include conducting an assessment of the public and private resources available; fostering coordination and collaboration with between parents and public and private entities to achieve greater efficiency and to fill gaps in services; facilitating community and state initiatives to address existing needs; implementing a public engagement campaign and facilitating communication between local and state entities; and maximize private sector funding to leverage with federal, state and local funds. The measure also authorizes the Board to employ a director and other staff as necessary and directs certain state agencies to make staff available to the Board to assist in implementation of the act. Finally, the bill authorizes the establishment of a not-for-profit foundation to raise private funds to assist in furthering the goals of the act.
