**Other Considerations**

As all agencies do, OKDHS currently prepares a Rule Impact Statement required by the Administrative Procedures Act. In the RIS we do respond to questions on how the proposed rules that affect all our recipients, including families.

Also, in paragraph A. the statement: "to issue a family impact statement of every proposed rule prior to or within 15 days after the date of publication of the notice of proposed rule adoption" may be better worded by removing "rule and adoption" and replacing with "rulemaking intent." This suggestion is based on the next sentence which says the family impact statement may be modified based on hearings and comments. After rules are adopted, no changes are made. Another consideration would be the number of laws the panel would need to review and the significant amount of time the review would entail.
