Cost Estimate of \$1,300

Research Analysis

The committee substitute for HB 2373 designates the section of highway 70B from the southern municipal limits of Kingston to Apple Street the “2nd Lt. Joe Lee Cunningham Memorial Highway”.

Further, the measure designates the section of State Highway 58 between Interstate 40 and E980 county road the “Fire Chief Nolan Schmidt Highway.”

Lastly, measure designates the bridge located on State Highway crossing the Cimarron River, north of Cushing, the “Sheriff Frank Phillips Memorial Bridge”.

Fiscal Analysis

The measure directs the Department of Transportation (ODOT) to place permanent markers upon the highway bearing the name of the person to be honored. The enactment of HB 1666 (2011) provides that the costs associated with signage related to the naming of highways and bridges is to be paid by the group sponsoring or requesting the sign, except in instances of a naming of a highway or bridge to honor members of the armed forces who were killed in action.

ODOT estimates the cost of markers to average \$650.00 each and, with the placement of markers for each direction of travel, the total estimated cost for placement for the memorials is \$1,300.
