Research Analysis

The committee substitute to HB 2609 reduces from 2 years to 1 year the amount of time which must elapse before a person charged with a misdemeanor can file for expungement. The measure provides that a person convicted of a nonviolent felony can seek expungement if the person has not been convicted of a misdemeanor in the last 15 years. The measure increases the time for notice of hearing by the court from 30 days to 45 days and requires objections to the petition to be filed 15 days prior to the hearing.
