Research Analysis

The committee substitute for HB 2669 relates to standard risk assessments of state agencies. The measure modifies requirement for a state agency to conduct an information security risk assessment to be conducted by a third party if an agency does not have an internal expert to conduct the assessment who can submit certification of such expertise along with the annual information security risk assessment. The measure provides an exception for certain agencies. The measure directs the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to approve at least two firms which state agencies can choose from to conduct the risk assessment. The measure requires agencies with an information technology system that is not consolidated under the Information Technology and Consolidation and Coordination Act or that is retained by the agency to submit a final report to the Information Services Division by the December 1st, each year. The measure deletes the current penalty for failure to comply.
