Research Analysis

HB 2841 establishes a three-day Wildlife Conservation Passport, in addition to the current annual passport, which costs \$1 more than the annual resident hunting or fishing license. The new, three-day passport is \$15. In the case of violation, where no passport or other license is held, the measure provides a fee schedule for a temporary license.

Fiscal Analysis

HB2841 proposes a three-day wildlife conservation passport at \$15.00 apiece. The amendments provided lower exemption age from 18 to 16 (for those needing to purchase passports). This bill also adds fees for anyone violating the provisions set forth. According to the Department, this bill should be basically revenue neutral. However, there is no way of knowing this at this time.
