Research Analysis

HB 2841 establishes one-day and three-day Wildlife Conservation Passports, in addition to the current Annual Wildlife Conservation Passport, which costs \$1 more than the annual resident hunting or fishing license. The new passports cost \$5 and \$7, respectively.

Fiscal Analysis

There is no way to calculate the exact amount of the negative fiscal impact because we have no way of knowing how many of the individuals purchasing the annual permit will buy the proposed 1-Day or 3-Day permit. There will be a negative impact because the intent of the current structure is to encourage the sale of a hunting and fishing permit in lieu of the conservation passport. Hunting and Fishing license holders are counted in determining how much federal funds are received by ODWC and persons purchasing the conservation passport are not counted for federal funds.
