**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 2904 modifies the definition of *tobacco product* to include, but is not limited to cigarettes, cigars, pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, snuff, snus, or e-cigarettes. FDA approved tobacco cessation products will not be considered a *tobacco product*. Additionally, such products cannot be taxed as provided for in current law unless the product is specifically provided for in those sections of law. The measure adds the term *electronic smoking device* and provides a definition. Lastly, the measure prohibits minors from purchasing or possessing e-cigarettes.
