**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 3399 prohibits the state from entering into agreements or contracts which cede state control over educational standards and systems. Additionally, the measure grants school districts two additional years to implement certain standards that align with common core. The measure directs the State Board of Education to evaluate English Language Arts and Mathematic curriculum standards and make any revisions necessary to improve the quality of education for students. The board must submit a report to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate that outlines the evaluation, comparison results, and list any revisions made to the standards.

**Fiscal Analysis**

State Department of Education personnel provide as related to CS for HB 3399, that federal law and regulations require implementation of rigorous standards by 2014. Postponement of implementation of college and career ready standards may result in the loss of certain federal funds. In addition, school districts would be required to now comply with No Child Left Behind. School districts that have not met 2014 performance benchmarks will be required to set aside 20% of Title I funds.
