Fiscal Analysis

Section 1: Specifies apportionment of certain appropriated and authorized funds in HB 2301 for local and state-supported financial support of public schools, and directs certain appropriated funds to specified areas and programs. Directs certain appropriated funds to the Administrative and Support Functions of the State Department of Education.

Section 2: Provides for budget categories and funds.

Section 3: Directs certain appropriated funds in HB 2301 to be transferred to the School Consolidation Assistance Fund.

Section 4: Directs certain appropriated funds in HB 2301 to be transferred to the Teachers' Retirement System Dedicated Revenue Revolving Fund.

Section 5: Provides for specific funds allocated in this act to be transferred to the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma.

Section 6: Provides for specific funds allocated in the act for Education Leadership Oklahoma to be specifically expended.

Section 7: Specifies expenditure of certain funds allocated in the act for Reform Implementation.

Section 8: Specifies expenditure of certain funds allocated in the act for Alternative and High Challenge Education.

Section 9: Directs certain funds allocated in the act to be specifically implemented for Financial Literacy.

Section 10: Specifies funds allocation for Early Intervention.

Section 11: Directs funds allocated in the act for the Early Childhood Initiative to be specifically

Expended.

Section 12: Directs funds allocated in the act for the Parent Training Program to be specifically expended.

Section 13: Directs funds allocated in the act for General Educational Development tests to be specifically used by recognized GED testing centers.

Section 14: Directs funds allocated in the act for the Rural Infant Stimulation Environment Program to be used for specified expenditures and operations.

Section 15: Requires duties and compensation of employees, unless otherwise specified by law to be set by the State Board of Education.

Section 16: Requires state aid funds to be reduced or withheld to ensure compliance with the Act.

Section 17: Authorizes the State Board of Education to request the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to transfer appropriated funds to an appropriate fund.

Section 18: Provides for certain school districts to take a proportionate reduction under certain circumstances.

Section 19: Provides for certain budgeting of appropriations, lapse dates, and encumbrances.

Section 20: Provides an effective date.

Section 21: Provides for an emergency.
