**Fiscal Analysis**

SB1183 requires Medical Examiner permit certificates in cases investigated solely for the purposes of transporting a body out of state. The measure authorizes the Board of Medicolegal Investigations to charge a fee for out of state shipments of human remains when the Medical Examiner is not required to conduct an investigation of the death. The measure also requires both a cremation permit and an out-of-state transport permit under certain circumstances. It is anticipated that the authorization and requirement of these permit fees will increase revenue to the Board of Medicolegal Investigations. The revenue increase would be dependent upon the number of additional permits issued.

SB1183 adds language requiring the Board of Medicolegal Investigations to provide for an eastern facility office. Although there is currently a facility in Tulsa, it is not a requirement. If the Board is required to provide, maintain and equip two separate offices in the future, there will be associated costs for personnel, facilities maintenance and equipment upgrades.
