**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure directs the Department of Transportation (ODOT) to place permanent markers upon the highway bearing the name. The enactment of HB 1666 (2011) provides that the costs associated with signage related to the naming of highways and bridges is to be paid by the group sponsoring or requesting the sign, except in instances of a naming of a highway or bridge to honor members of the armed forces who were killed in action. The honoree is a member of our Armes Forces killed in action.

ODOT estimates the cost of markers to average \$650.00 each and, with the placement of markers for each direction of travel, the total estimated cost for placement is \$1,300.
