SB 1433 adds human trafficking to the list of 85% crimes and requires offenders to be in compliance with the standards for Class level 2 behavior to qualify for achievement earned credits.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB1433 adds human trafficking to the list of crimes that require that an offender serve a minimum of 85% of their sentence. Every person convicted and sentenced to the custody of the Department of Corrections will cost the state approximately \$49 per day for each day of incarceration. The fiscal impact would be dependent upon the number of adjudicated cases and the number of additional days the offender is incarcerated.
