**Research Analysis**

SB 1538 provides that a civil action brought in a human trafficking case may be instituted in the district court in the county in which the prospective defendant resides or has committed any act which subjects him or her to liability. The measure provides that the statute of limitations shall not commence until the plaintiff discovers or reasonably should have discovered that he or she was a victim of human trafficking and that the defendant caused, was responsible for or profited from the human trafficking.
