**Research Analysis**

SB 1739 provides that a person in custody in a county jail is primarily responsible for the payment of the cost of medical care for a self-inflicted injury or a preexisting condition. The measure allows the sheriff to negotiate with a medical provider to pay disputed medical expenses. The measure allows a peace officer to take a person directly to a medical facility for emergency medical care prior to fingerprinting the person.
