**Honoring Six Armed Forces Members:
Cost Estimate of \$7,800**

Research Analysis

SB 418 designates and provides location for the following: “Bill Swisher Memorial Highway”; the “Specialist Dylan Johnson Memorial Bridge”; the “SGT First Class David Clinton Fisher Memorial Highway”; the “Private First Class John Bennie Laskey Memorial Bridge”; the “Wayne Crusoe Memorial Highway”; the “Wayman Tisdale Memorial Highway”; the “Sergeant Bret Isenhower Memorial Highway”; the “Pikey’s Crossing Memorial Highway”; the “Petty Officer Tony Randolph Memorial Highway”; the “Specialist Howard Lee Jones Memorial Bridge”; and the OHP Captain Pete Norwood Memorial Highway.

Fiscal Analysis

The measure directs the Department of Transportation (ODOT) to place permanent markers upon the highway bearing the names of those to be honored. The enactment of HB 1666 (2011) provides that the costs associated with signage related to the naming of highways and bridges is to be paid by the group sponsoring or requesting the sign, except in instances of a naming of a highway or bridge to honor members of the armed forces who were killed in action. Six of the honored are members of our Armed Forces killed in action, while five are not military related honors.

ODOT estimates the cost of markers to average \$650.00 each and, with the placement of markers for each direction of travel, the total estimated cost for placement for the six military memorials is \$7,800.
